EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

URBAN ACADEMY AND DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY

his year, we welcomed 200 Urban Academy students for a dynamic and engaging **MLK Day** celebration. Through art, music, dance, and educational activities, students explored the legacies of **Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.** and playwright **August Wilson**—two transformative figures whose work and leadership continue to inspire.

The program fostered learning and creativity while encouraging students to draw connections between historical and cultural heroes.

In addition to MLK Day, our ongoing collaboration with Urban Academy includes a student-led tour guide program at **The Writer's Landscape** exhibit. This initiative empowers students to share their knowledge and voices as they guide visitors through the world of August Wilson, deepening their understanding of his impact on literature and social change.

ur ongoing partnership with Hazelwood Local continues to grow, marking its third successful year in 2024. Each year, our collaborative events have grown, with last year's event bringing together over 700 community members. STORYTELLING FOR ALL AGES

WAACC's **Youth Writers Camp** celebration and poetry slam gave young writers a platform to shine. We also launched a special event for adult learners—a screening of the **Paul Laurence Dunbar** documentary—attended by 80 people. The discussion linked Dunbar's works to August Wilson, inspiring creative exploration. These programs promote literacy, storytelling, and community engagement across all ages. PITTSBURGH INTERNATIONAL JAZZ FESTIVAL

n 2024, the **14th Annual Pittsburgh International Jazz Festival** (PIJF) celebrated an important homecoming, making its triumphant return to our downtown streets, spotlighting Pittsburgh's rich jazz legacy and its enduring influence on the global jazz scene.

The festivities commenced on September 19 with the signature Jazz Train, featuring live performances by acclaimed pianist **Orrin Evans** and vocalist **Vanisha Gould**. Departing from New York City with stops in Newark and Philadelphia, the journey set the tone for a weekend of musical celebration.

On September 20, **Maysa** performed for a sold-out crowd and the **Taste of Jazz Party** offered more than 500 guests culinary delights from 15 local restaurants, alongside musical performances throughout the AWAACC building.

Over the weekend of September 21–22, Liberty Avenue transformed into an electric jazz hub with FREE outdoor performances. The lineup included Grammy winning pianist Robert Glasper, the dynamic Marsha Ambrosius, acclaimed blues vocalist Shemekia Copeland, Cuban sensation Cimafunk, and a final Pittsburgh performance by the legendary Average White Band. Also featured: Sean Jones, Endea Owens & The Cookout, Orrin Evans, Emmet Cohen, Brazilian songstress Luedji Luna, and Howie Alexander.

The 2024 Pittsburgh International Jazz Festival was co-presented by **Highmark Blue** Cross Blue Shield, with additional support provided by the Mellon Foundation and other major sponsors, including The Wilson Group, UPMC and UPMC Health Plan, Visit Pittsburgh, Rivers Casino, BMW of Pittsburgh, Bacardi, and Xfinity/Comcast, and more.





COLLECTIONS IN BLACK EXHIBITION

he AWAACC fosters creativity and community through its **B.U.I.L.D. Residency Program.** In 2024, B.U.I.L.D. artist-in-residence **Phillip Thompson** presented his groundbreaking exhibition *Collections in Black: A Celebration of Black Comic Book Culture*.

Delving into the significant contributions of African American collectors, artists, writers, and creators from the Golden Age of comics to the present, *Collections in Black* reflected Phill's passion for storytelling and visual art. It featured original works by artists like **Shawn Martinbrough** and **John Jennings**, alongside rare collectors items. Visitors also had an opportunity to preview Phill's documentary film featuring interviews with artists across the country and documenting some of the rarest comic and art collections. By merging traditional artistic techniques with contemporary influences, Phill captured the essence of Black experiences and their profound influence on the world of comics and visual culture.

Supported by the **Richard King Mellon Foundation**, the B.U.I.L.D. Residency provides a vital platform for African American artists in Pittsburgh to develop their craft, engage with the community, and showcase their work.
